What is a charity legacy?

A Charity legacy is a bequest to a charity or charities of your choice which will come from your estate in the event of your death. There are three types of charity legacy you can leave in a Will:



A residuary gift – this is the remainder (or a share of) your estate after expenses and other gifts have been deducted



A pecuniary gift – this is a sum of money



A specific gift – this is a specific item, such as a house or painting

How do I make a charity legacy?



The best thing to do is to make an appointment with your solicitor.

You can either update your current Will using a Codicil, or add or change specific wording in your Will detailing your donation.

If you don't already have a Will, it's a good idea to make one.

An up-to-date Will is an important document to have as it will give you control over your affairs and will remove any uncertainty for those left behind.
